His career in the army with the
Montgomery Imperial Yeomanry
took him on the South African
Campaign

He was awarded the Imperial
Yeomanry Long Service and Good
Conduct Medal

At the time of his death his unit
was part of the supply chain and
hospital site developed to defend
the Suez Canal

He died of malaria on the
10th May, 1919, aged 39

Buried or cremated to lie in the
cemetery of el-Qantarah, El
Sharqiyya , El Isma ilia, Port Said

Remembered in the Kantara War
Memorial Cemetery, Egypt
